Work with a wide range of different materials for drawing including pen & ink. Use a viewfinder to select an area of a subject for drawing. Have the opportunity to draw on a very large scale – eg. with charcoal or marker pens as well as on a very small scale. Gain understanding of how to make objects appear further away by making them smaller & lighter in tone. Look at & talk about the work of artists using different kinds of approaches to drawing, identifying what drawing materials & techniques they've used.
